ABOUT US

Saiyed Foundation (SF) was established in 2016 in the United States as a registered Non-Profit, IRS 501(c)3. Our mission is to provide emergency and medical relief to poor and underprivileged populations. SF has an integrated holistic model that provides delivery of primary and preventive medical care to those who would otherwise have no access. Through its community outreach, SF brings free, quality healthcare to vulnerable and underserved areas by providing free medications, medical devices, and supplies. SF's focus is on wellness, prevention, and treatment for chronic conditions such as diabetes and hypertension, which helps prevent complications & morbidity.

Since founding, SF as a family foundation has been offering medical relief in India with a long history of charitable activities from three generations of physicians. SF has established sustainable mobile clinics in over 15 villages that have no clinics, hospitals, pharmacies or physicians. SF has also organized dental campaigns to raise awareness in hygiene and dental issues. Finally, SF partners with charity hospitals for patients that need further care and referrals.



Our mission is to provide life saving medical relief to poor and underprivileged in rural villages, regardless of race, color, origin, religion, ethnicity, gender, sex, or cast.

A bi- annual report is a quick update summary of our activities through the current year. This report is intended to share information with our supporters & partners about our activities.

2021 started with an intense COVID-19 Delta variant surge around the world due to evolving variants of the virus. Hospitals faced the challenges of increasing numbers of very sick patients.

India has been our focus from our decades of working on the ground, loved ones being affected & personal calls of action from network hospitals. On April 27th, President Biden promised to increase aid to India for a pandemic response. The aforementioned factors coupled with our extensive healthcare network in the United States, gave us the unique position to respond to these extraordinary circumstances. Our Help Gujarat Breathe campaign urgently airlifted four shipments of 10,000 life saving medical equipment in matter of weeks. In this report, we will describe in detail the funds raised, how they were utilized, and the impact. Without the generosity and support of our donors, friends, family and partners our pandemic response would not be possible.

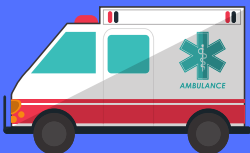

Because of your support, we were able to accomplish the following:

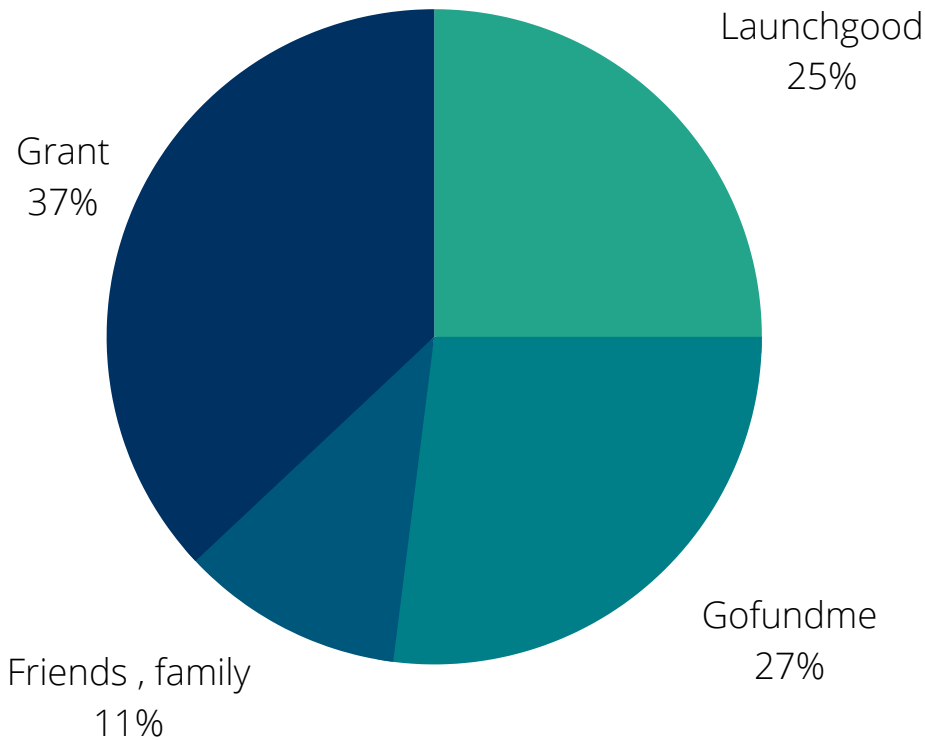
- **Purchase ICU invasive ventilators**, so that hospitals can open much needed ICU beds to support the surge in patients that need life support.
- **Purchase Non-invasive BIPAP machines**, so that patients can be supported before being intubated or placed on life support.
- **Provide Oxygen Concentrators**, so that patients in need could have guaranteed oxygen supply when needed.
- **Send PPE KN95 masks** to support our incredible doctors, nurses, and staff. Proving them safety as they take care for patients during this difficult time.
- **Purchase voltage converters**, so that American 110 v medical grade equipment can be used on 220 v Indian standard in hospitals.
- **Secure four air cargo flights on Indian Airlines & Qatar Airways**, to urgently send critical supplies: taking days rather than weeks to deliver life-saving care.

In the most trying of times, we received an outpouring of support from our community. This support allowed us to save lives..

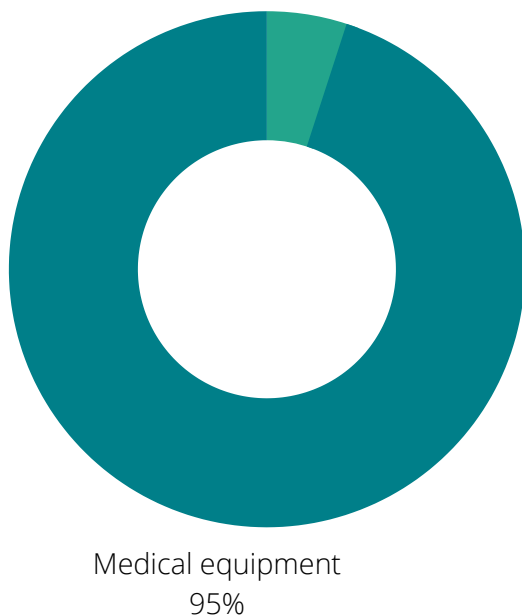

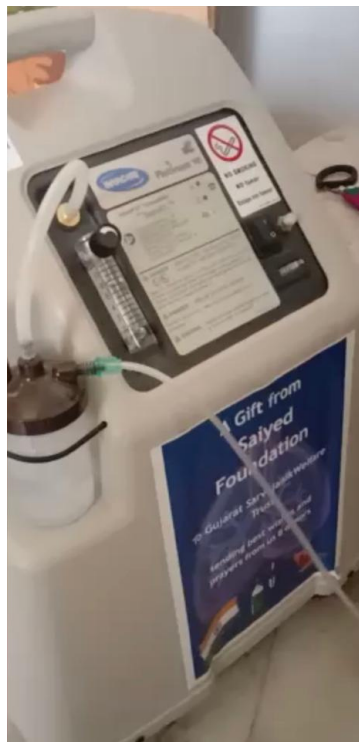
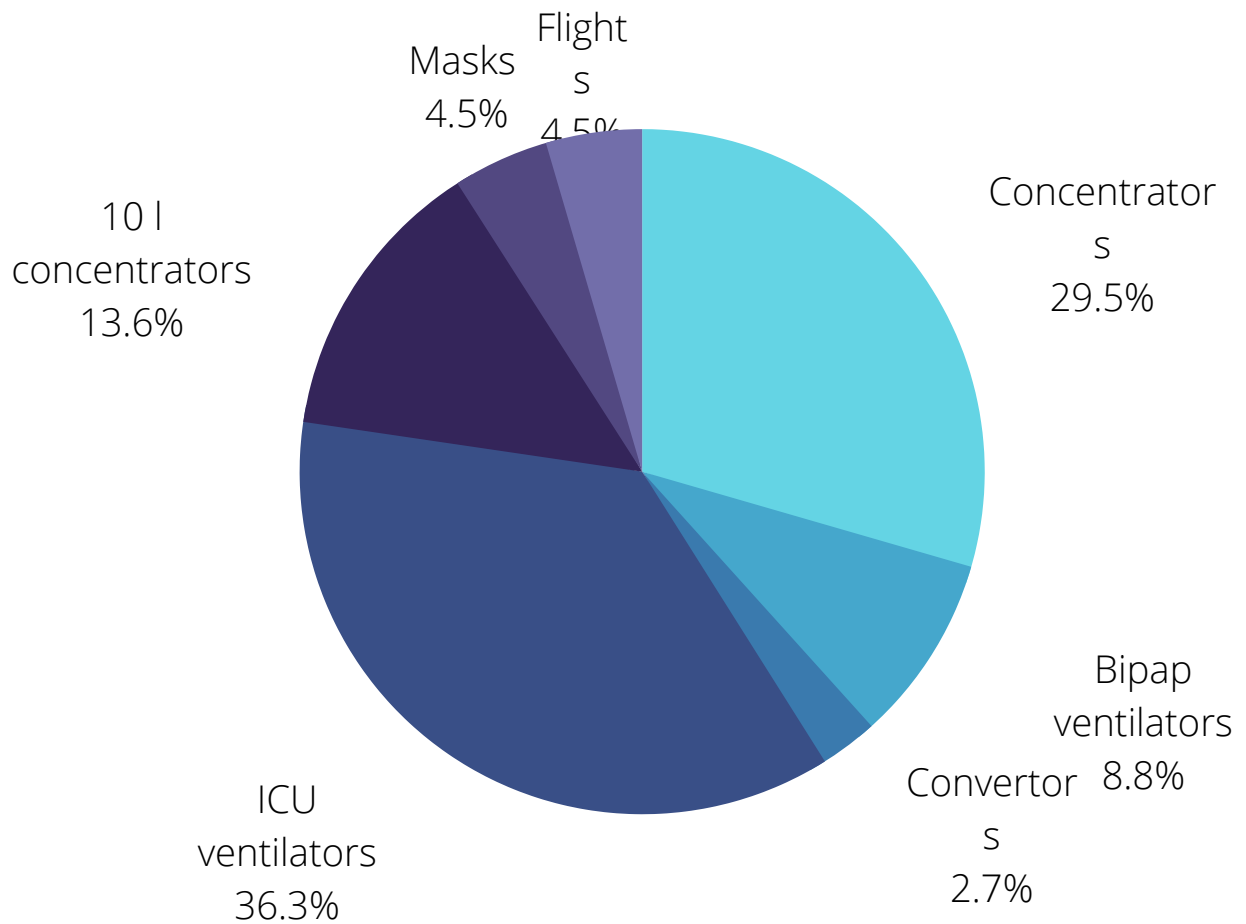


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ALLOCATION OF 100% DONATIONS SPENT

We invested more than we raised from our campaign. Audited Financial Statements available end of fiscal year.

PHASE 1

This April, we launched the **Help Gujarat Breathe Campaign**, our first ask to public donors.



We delivered:

**100 oxygen concentrators,
13 BIPAP Noninvasive ventilators and
120 voltage convertors for 220**

All of this was accomplished within 12 days of our campaign launch on May 9.



PHASE 2

Our partner hospitals identified the need to increase ICU capacity.

Why? ICU ventilators and life support machines keep patients alive when they are unable to breath independently.



Despite an extreme shortage and low stockpiles in the United States, we were able to quickly source 15 ICU ventilators and PM kits through a reputable vendor in Florida.



PHASE 3

10 L OXYGEN CONCENTRATORS

Initially, our partner hospitals had asked for 10 liter oxygen concentrators. Despite exhaustive searches nationally and internationally, we were not able to find any inventory in our earlier phases. Finally, we found a small supply of 13 available units.



We immediately purchased & shipped them to our partner hospitals in India.

PHASE 4

Strategic Planning

Our healthcare experts had several strategic crisis planning meetings with hospitals we supported to support. During these meetings we discussed:

- Best practices to utilize sourced medical equipment
- Patient education on hygiene practices and medical device use
- Deployment plan informed by feasibility studies to support local infrastructure
- Long term support & maintenance with biomed
- Hospital surge planning



AIR LIFT

**4 air freights +
6 flights +
4 ground transport trucks
= 33,320 miles transported**



Due to urgency of critically needed equipment, we sent all cargo via air freight. We engaged two cargo companies and changed multiple flights to minimize travel time. Obstacles during this process included severely disrupted supply chains, governments prioritizing their supplies and travel bans. Our first flight landed on May 8, 2021, an incredible 12 days from launch of campaign. This was no small feat. It was made possible from tireless hours and the tenacity of our volunteers & shipping companies. We are also thankful that India customs cleared the cargo in less than a day. In addition, our local volunteers were able to obtain free trucks to ship supplies within India.
